

Teen (15-19 Years) Birth Rate Anne Arundel County, 2007-2017




Infant Deaths by Race/Ethnicity



The mortality rate remained highest among non-Hispanic Black infants over the past five years and is nearly 3 times the rate of non-Hispanic White infants. However, all rates decreased from 2016-2017.

INFANT HEALTH IN ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY




The top causes of infant mortality included preterm/low birthweight and congenital abnormalities.


The preterm birth rate increased from 2016 to 2017 in all race/ethnicity groups except for Hispanic. However, more women initiated prenatal care in the first trimester in 2017 compared to 2016, and fewer women had late or no prenatal care.


While the average number of babies born with low birthweight in the county met the Healthy People 2020 goal of less than 7.8% between 2013 and 2017, there were many zip codes that did not meet this goal (shown in red on the map below).

Note: Preterm infants are born at less than 37 weeks gestation. Low birthweight infants weigh 5.5 pounds or less at birth. Early prenatal care is initiation during the first trimester (1-3 months). Late prenatal care is initiation during the third trimester.
