**Free Confidential HIV Counseling and Testing:** For an appointment at a health center near you, call 410-222-7108.

**A Service for Telling Your Partner:** A specially trained staff member helps people with HIV/AIDS let their sex partners or other contacts know if they should be tested. This is done without naming the HIV-positive person. Call 410-222-7176 and ask for the staff member who does “partner notification.”

### **Case Management:**

This service helps people with HIV/AIDS get services they may need, such as:

- Primary medical and dental care
- Family support
- Pharmacy coverage
- Client advocacy
- Transportation
- Housing
- Medical Assistance Application
- Nutritional counseling
- Emotional support and counseling
- Social service, mental health and substance abuse referrals
- Information on HIV/AIDS and related health issues

**Substance Abuse Referrals:** Inpatient and outpatient treatment referral services are available. Contact Case Management at 410-222-7108 or Adult Addiction Services at 410-222-0100.

**HIV Outreach and Education:** Trained staff help young people and adults learn ways to prevent HIV and other STDs through programs where learning is fun. Games, poetry, role play, skits and skill practice are used in the sessions. The free programs can be tailored to the needs of the individual or group. **Maryland AIDS Drug Assistance Program (MADAP):** This program helps income-eligible Maryland residents with or without insurance that are infected with HIV get the medicines that are needed to treat, prevent or relieve certain HIV-related conditions. **Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP):** A way for people who do not have HIV to help prevent HIV infection by taking a pill every day. The pill contains two medicines that are also used, in combination with other medicines, to treat HIV. When someone is exposed to HIV, PrEP can help stop the virus from establishing a permanent infection. When used consistently, PrEP has been shown to greatly reduce the risk of HIV infection in people who are at substantial risk.
